Through the assistance of YBI, Xaloy has transformed its intense manual process by integrating the Industrial Internet of Things (IIoT) into its quality management system. Xaloy received funding through YBI's SBA SMART² project grant, marking a significant step forward for the company.

Previously relying on an Excel-based approach, the transition to a fully electronic system has streamlined operations, consolidating all data in one easily accessible location on Xaloy's server. This shift not only enhances efficiency but also fosters a more organized workflow.

Ron Seifert, Director of Quality for Xaloy, emphasized the broader impact of this transformation, stating, "It's provided great structure. Improving technology not only benefits us - but also the county, city, and state. When you find a better way to do things, it saves time, money, and jobs."

Droxi, EVOLVE's Israeli medtech startup (with an established US operational base in Youngstown), is an Al co-pilot for providers and other medical professionals that solves EHR Inbox overload.

- Using Droxi, providers spend 80% less time on admin tasks,
- Providers have a 200% increase in response speed.
- · This, in turn, can dramatically increase revenue for healthcare organizations.

Droxi has signed contracts with various healthcare systems in the US and is on target to achieve \$1.15M ARR by the end of 2024. **Droxi recently closed a significant** funding round (due to a direct connection made by YBI), enabling them to hire seven new Youngstown-based employees to help quickly scale the company throughout the US market.

MBAC Client Aundrea Cika secured funding through the state of Ohio, which was one of the first loans awarded to our team in this region. She also **secured her first** government contract with the National Park Service to design and illustrate a children's activity book for the Nicodemus National Historic Site in Nicodemus, Kansas. Aundrea was also awarded \$5.000

for a statewide pitch competition hosted by the Minority Business Development Division of the Department of Development.





Empowering Future Innovators

At our first Youth Marketplace at YBI, 17 youthrun businesses launched with support from local entrepreneurs, including Hannah Ferguson from DOPE Cider House. Students developed their pitching, branding, and product development skills, with one student earning over \$400 in profit in just two hours. These hands-on experiences, combined with mentoring, highlighted the transformative potential of entrepreneurship

Through virtual reality, students from Mahoning, Trumbull, and Columbiana counties explored 23 career fields, including aerospace engineering and graphic design. This experience helped them develop confidence and curiosity about their futures. Collaborations with organizations such as America Makes and JuggerBot3D exposed over 1,200 students to advanced manufacturing and STEM careers, providing underserved communities with life-changing opportunities.
